

<TQ=99>(06EFT)12. This band composed “Theatre of the Soul” and “Bastard Son of a Thousand Blues” for their fifth album Native Tongue. Formed with guitarist Matt Smith, they sing about “a small-town girl with her whole life packed in a suitcase by her feet,” lamenting that “sometimes you can’t choose, it’s like heads they win, tails you’re gonna lose” in the song “Fallen Angel,” which joins a cover of “Your Mama Don’t Dance” on Open Up and Say...Ahh!. Named after Mick Shrimpton’s shirt in This is Spinal Tap, other members include bassist Bobby Dall, drummer Rikki Rockett, and lead singer Bret Michaels. FTP, name this band which also has C.C. DeVille, an 80s glam metal group maybe best known for “Every Rose Has Its Thorn.”  
Answer: Poison

<TQ=99>(06EFT)4. One character suggests a game of taking three Excedrin PMs and trying to whack off before you fall asleep, adding that the best part is that you always win. Two references are made to the band Asia; “Heat of the Moment” accompanies the final chase scene and the main character has a framed poster of the band, which is gay according to another character, along with liking Coldplay and the movie Maid in Manhattan. A store which exists only to sell other people’s stuff on EBay is owned by Trish, played by Catherine Keener, who convinces the main character to sell his extensive collection of toy action figures. FTP, name this 2005 comedy about that guy Andy, played by Steve Carrell, a man who has shockingly never had sex.

Answer: The 40-Year Old Virgin (accept The Once and Future Chris Frankel)

Charles Chesnutt’s final novel is about the colonel’s one, and Arthur Schnitzler wrote about this type of story, a work featuring the married couple Doctor Fridolin and Albertina which was adapted into a famous movie. Derek Walcott wrote about one of these on Monkey Mountain, featuring the characters Makak and Moustique. Jorge Luis Borges wrote a collection on these type of tigers, an Old English poem talks about one “of the Rood,” and a Nathaniel West work talks about this life of Balso Snell. Langston Hughes wrote about a montage of one of these deferred, and a work of Chinese lit talks about one “of the Red Chamber.” FTP, name this common literary word, an experience you might have while sleeping.

Answer: dreams (the movie is Eyes Wide Shut)

<TQ=99>(06EFT)16. This player spent a brief stint with the Oakland Athletics from 1998-99, but was traded away to the Mets in return for Terrence Long. The Athletics had acquired him from the Yankees, in return for third baseman Scott Brosius. Known for spending his childhood picking strawberries on his father’s farm, he is now a three-time Gold Glove winner, probably partly for his habit of diving recklessly off the mound to field ground balls. Second all-time in pickoffs behind Mark Langston, his no-hitter came against the Angels in 1994. Selected by Ozzie Guillen to start this year’s all-star game, FTP, name this veteran Detroit Tigers pitcher infamous for knocking over a cameraman who is logically known as the “Gambler.”

Answer: Kenny Rogers

<TQ=99>(06EFT)5. This is the name of a kooky paramilitary group formed within the Orange Order in the 1960s by the so-called “Beast of Kincora,” William McGrath. It is also the largest tributary of the Drina River, which flows near a namesake mountain and national park in Serbia. In Hindu mythology, she is the wife of the monkey king Vali in the Ramayana, and the wife of Brihaspati who is abducted by the god Soma and gives birth to a son named Budha. Meaning “star” in Sanskrit, FTP, give this name shared by Willow’s lesbian lover on Buffy the Vampire Slayer, the plantation home of Scarlett O’Hara, and a perpetually drunken actress Reid of American Pie fame.

Answer: Tara

<TQ=99>(06EFT)15. When he buys a fortune-telling kit, he becomes convinced that Count Istvan Teleky is granting his wishes. His landlady is Mrs. Mendelbright, and at one point Myrt “Hubcaps” Lesh sells him a car that turns out to be a lemon. Although he appears friendly with the waitress Juanita, it soon becomes clear that his primary girlfriend is Thelma Lou. He was replaced by Warren Ferguson, after one last encounter with Ernest T. Bass, ending his time in Mayberry. FTP, name this classic TV character on The Andy Griffith Show, a bumbling deputy played by Don Knotts.

Answer: Barney Fife (either name)

<TQ=99>(06EFT)10. In one of this man’s movies, a strong wind forces him and his girlfriend’s uncle Fumio to put on blindfolds. In addition to that remake of The Chinese Connection, he starred in a film in which he defeats Flying Snow, Broken Sword and Sky in order to get within ten steps of the King of Qin. After winning an all-round gold medal in a national wushu competition at the age of 11, he went on to star in the Shaolin Temple and Once Upon a Time in China series. FTP name this martial arts movie actor who starred in Romeo Must Die opposite Aaliyah.

Answer: Jet Li or Li Lianjie

<TQ=99>(06EFT)9. He ended his career after noting that "when the third baseman has to do my work for me, it's time to quit." He was moved to St. Louis, leaving Cleveland to compile the worst season in baseball history. He is known for out-dueling Rube Waddell after Waddell had called him a "hayseed," pitching a perfect game in the midst of 24 consecutive no-hit innings. Commissioner Ford Frick commemorated his achievements the year after he died. Given his nickname while pitching on a minor league team in Canton, Ohio, FTP identify this baseball player who earned his 511th win in 1911 and who gives his name to an award for each league's most outstanding pitcher.

Answer: Denton True "Cy" Young

<TQ=99>(06EFT)16. One character on this show introduces himself as Chareth Cutestory (CHAIR-eth CUTE-story) to a woman with a blind dog named Justice. Another character, who appears to the theme music "Solid as a Rock," is the business model Starla. Starla is hired by a former Hot Cop who turns out to be the father of Steve Holt. That man is blackballed by the Magician's Alliance after attempting to hide his father in the Aztec Tomb from the SEC's raid on the family yacht in the pilot episode. Featuring Jeffrey Tambor and Jason Bateman, FTP name this recently-canceled Fox show focusing on the Bluth family.

Answer: Arrested Development

<TQ=99>(06EFT)9. President Eisenhower gives his name to a pond at the site where this competition is played. The Silver Cup is awarded to the best amateur player here, in recognition of its founding by Clifford Roberts and a famed amateur. First won by Horton Smith, it is the site of six victories by Jack Nicklaus and Gene Sarazen's "shot heard 'round the world." Featuring a course designed by Alister MacKenzie including three holes known as Amen Corner, FTP identify this brainchild of Bobby Jones whose winner is presented with a green jacket, and which is held in Augusta, Georgia.

Answer: Masters Tournament (accept answer of "Augusta" before "this tournament" in first line)

<TQ=99>(06EFT)4. At one point in this film, following the giving of instructions to keep the press out, one of the main characters rebuffs the cuddling advances of an Asian homosexual, telling him, "Cuddle? What a fag." Ron Jeremy makes a brief appearance as Vincenzo Lipazzi, who tells a bad joke to a mob boss and who is the "fat man" on whose eyes Detective Paul Smecker finds a pair of silver coins. Rocco kills Donna's cat to bring closure to their relationship in this film, which ends with the titular characters reuniting with their father, Il Duce, after he sees them reciting the prayer he taught them as children, and executing Yakavetta in the court room. Featuring Sean Flannery and Norman Reedus as Connor and Murphy McManus and Willem Defoe as Smecker, for ten points, identify this Troy Duffy movie about a pair of Irish vigilantes.

Answer: The Boondock Saints

<TQ=99>(06EFT)21. Stephanie Brown and Carrie Kelly are the only two women to use this name; the former died due to her impulsiveness, and the latter exists in an alternate, dystopic future. Timothy Drake currently holds the title, and struggled to keep his secret life hidden from his father, and Jason Todd was the second to use this name, until he was killed. He was recently resurrected due to the changes in reality during "Infinite Crisis," and for a time used the alias "Red Hood." Dick Grayson was the first to hold this title until he "graduated" and became Nightwing. For ten points, identify this character portrayed by Chris O'Donnell in the 1995 movie Batman Forever, Batman's sidekick.

Answer: Robin

This man became good friends with Tori Amos when she had a friend drop off a tape at his table during a convention, and he is referenced in several of her songs, including "Tear in Your Hand." He created the character of Richard Mayhew, whose adventures in London Below are chronicled in his novel Neverwhere, and he adapted the English version of the script for Princess Mononoke. One character from his better-known novel is the central focus of his 2005 Anansi's Boys, and his collaborators include Terry Pratchett, with whom this man worked on Good Omens. The author of the Hugo Award-winning American Gods, for ten points, identify this British-born sci-fi writer, best known for writing the graphic novel The Sandman.

Answer: Neil Gaiman

<TQ=99>(06EFT)11. One of this band's songs recounts how the singer was "foppin' and rockin', had the whole house boppin'," and ends with the repeated refrain "fopp and rock." Another song accuses the addressee of staring at the singer in your "Jesus Christ Pose"; that song is contained on their fourth album, whose release was eclipsed by Nirvana's Nevermind. Their last full album contained a song with the refrain "I don't like where you got me hanging from," "Pretty Noose," but this band is more famous for its 1994 release, which contained songs like "Fell on Black Days" and another in which the title character is

encouraged to "steal the rhythm while you can," "Spoonman." Comprising, in part, Matt Cameron, Ben Shephard, and Kim Thayil, for ten points, identify this Seattle grunge band fronted by Chris Cornell which released such albums as Louder than Love and Superunknown, which contained their hit, "Black Hole Sun."

Answer: Soundgarden

<TQ=99>(06EFT)1. Near the end of this song, the singer proclaims that he's like Buddy Rich when he flies off the handle, and in the second verse asks whether "you'll shut me down with a push of your button." Noting that "your crystal ball ain't so crystal clear," the singer mentions a thorn in his side, before postulating the titular activity as the reason for whatever is going on in this song. Today, this song may be better remembered for its Spike Jonze-directed video, whose opening scenes include a police car plowing into some cardboard boxes, and which stars Sir Stewart Wallace as himself, Nathan Wind as Cochese, Vic Colfari as Bobby "the Rookie," and Alasondro Alegre as "The Chief." Including assertions by the singer that he is going to "set it straight, this Watergate," for ten points, identify this 1994 single by the Beastie Boys off Ill Communication, whose title is not a mirage, but a nefarious activity.

Answer: Sabotage

<TQ=99>(06EFT)7. In one of the works in which he appears, he engages in a hat-shooting contest with a man who is on a mission to avenge his sister. The only person to address him by a proper name is a gravedigger in whose shack he hides in an earlier film, in which a metal plate is instrumental in saving him from a Winchester rifle. More famously, he is saved from death in the desert when he accidentally obtains from a dying Confederate soldier the location of Bill Carson's gold. In that film, following the Ennio Morricone-composed piece "Il Triello", he kills Angel Eyes having the night before unloaded the gun of Tuco Ramirez. For ten points, identify this character played by Clint Eastwood in A Fistfull of Dollars, For a Few Dollars More, and The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly.

Answer: the man with no name or Blondie or Joe

<TQ=99>(06EFT)9. The title of a 1995 album by the band hum claimed that you would prefer one of these. With the year "1980" attached, this word forms the alternate title of the Japanese disaster film Yosei Gorasu, and a movie about a reluctant one was made in 1967 with Don Knotts in the title role. It was also the initial occupation of John Jameson, who fought against Spiderman as Man-Wolf and Star-God, and Forrest Gump spent some time as one in the book, which resulted in him crash-landing in New Guinea. Other fictional ones include Stanislaw Lem's Pirx the Pilot, while an aluminum sculpture representing fallen ones is the only piece of art on the moon. For ten points, identify this profession, most notably practiced by such people as John Glenn, Alan Shepphard, and Neil Armstrong, and which involves traveling through space.

Answer: astronaut

<TQ=99>(07EFT)8. In a song of this name, the singer warns the listeners that "sitting on the fence, that's a dangerous course" because "you could even catch a bullet from the peace-keeping force," and in the last verse, advises mothers to lock up their daughters. That song is found on an album which contains such tracks as "News" and "Single-Handed Sailor," while a recent album of this name contains the single "Suburban Knights" and was the follow up to 2005's Stars of CCTV. More famous is the film of this name, in which Henry Fonda as the villain Frank squares off against Harmonica, played by Charles Bronson to music composed by Ennio Morricone. For ten points, give the shared title of a movie directed by Sergio Leone, the first track from Dire Straits' Communique, and the latest album release from the British band Hard-Fi, which refers to a singular occurrence in the Occident.

Answer: Once Upon a Time in the West

<TQ=99>(07EFT)5. Orlin once created one of these devices using several capacitors and a toaster, and the Mark IX tactical nuclear weapon was specifically designed to destroy them. They normally can only remain active for 38 minutes, and are composed of the superconductor naquadah. A second, slightly more advanced group of these objects was recently discovered in the Pegasus Galaxy. Their inner tracks contain 39 symbols, 7 of which are used in a given address. The first of these objects seen was uncovered at an archaeological dig in Giza, and was decoded by Daniel Jackson. FTP, name these fictional wormhole-creating devices, one of which is used by a Cheyenne Mountain facility whose flagship team is SG-1.

Answer: Stargate or Ring of the Gods or Circle of Standing Water or Ancestral Ring or Stone Ring or Annulus or Chappa'ai or The OI' Orifice (FYI: The Mark IX is the "Gatebuster", so its uniquely identifying)

<TQ=99>(07EFT)13. In one work in which these characters appear, they instruct another character to bring a musical to Broadway, but not one written by Andrew Lloyd Webber. In the original work, it is because of them that the help of Roger is enlisted, but even afterwards, they request that their previous assignment be repeated in order to create a two-level effect

with a path running down the middle. It is peculiar that it is only in this encounter that they begin to react strongly to the word "it," which allows a group of men to escape past these people, who are also famed for saying, "Peng" and "Nyy-wom." FTP, name these characters from Monty Python and the Holy Grail who demand that King Arthur bring them a shrubbery if he does not wish to them speak a certain monosyllabic word.

Answer: Knights who say, "Ni!" [prompt on partial answer]

<TQ=99>(07EFT)6. His bodyguards originally consisted of a brainwashed group of 16-year old girls called "The Dolls", each one named after a different month of the year. The fortune teller Rose shared a soul with him, because he had to expel all of the good in his soul to master "Psycho Power". He tried to transfer his consciousness into Cammy White, who was revealed to be a clone of him. He hosts the second World Warrior tournament as revenge for the destruction of his satellite, but Akuma sends his soul to hell, and he is never heard from again. He was the head of the criminal organization Shadaloo until his death, where his subordinates included Balrog, Vega, and Sagat. FTP, name this Psycho-Crusher-using military crime lord and opponent of Guile, Ryu, Ken, and Chun-Li, the main antagonist of the Street Fighter series.

Answer: M. Bison

<TQ=99>(07EFT)11. This event was reported by Julie Traylor, and the victim was hit by a protester's thrown tomato right before it happened. One of the perpetrators was apprehended by James Barnes and Samuel Wilson after attempting to escape in a helicopter. The other assailant was discovered to be acting under the hypnotic suggestion of Dr. Faustus. It occurred outside of a courthouse where the victim was to stand trial for leading the Secret Avengers against the Superhuman Registration Act, and the series "Fallen Son" deals with the fallout from this event. Carried out by Sharon Carter and Crossbones and orchestrated by the Red Skull, FTP, name this event that occurred at the end of Marvel Comics' Civil War that resulted in the death of Steve Rogers.

Answer: The Assassination of Captain America (Accept reasonable equivalents; accept Steve Rogers instead of Captain America before mention)

Various characters on this show have found a guitar and sung, "Robert DeNiro, Bela Lugosi, Snuffleupagus, and Parker Posie," told a joke comparing its host to a mallard with a cold, and stated that the Shakespeare play about a merchant in Venice was Footloose. The latter is associated with a character who once put "Kick Me" signs on the back of other characters. That character wished to be called Turd Ferguson in his last appearance on this show, and he knew surprisingly little about such things as "Condiments" and "A Petit Dejeuner." While French Stewart cannot identify the sound a dog makes, Sean Connery tells Will Ferrell's character that it's "just the way your mother likes it." FTP, name this Saturday Night Live spoof of an Alex Trebek-hosted game show.

Answer: Celebrity Jeopardy [prompt on "Saturday Night Live" before mention]

<TQ=99>(07EFT)9. Sandra Myers represented this nation as a sprinter from 1987 onwards, while Alice Matejkova also represented it as a discus thrower in the last three Olympic games. In soccer, this nation won a silver medal at its Olympic debut in Belgium in 1920, but could not overcome either West Germany or England when hosting the first 24-team World Cup on home soil in 1982. The last man before Lance Armstrong to win the Tour de France five consecutive times hailed from this nation, while a golfer from this nation took third place at the US Open in 1987 and was the first European to win the Masters, doing so in 1980. In 1990, Monica Seles broke the record for youngest winner of the French Open set in 1989 by a player from this country. For ten points, identify this nation, home to such athletes as Miguel Indurain, Arantxa Sanchez Vicario, and Seve Ballesteros, as well as such club teams as Betis Sevilla and FC Barcelona.

Answer: Spain or Espana

<TQ=99>(07EFT)8. In one episode, this character wields the Tonfa of Takanawa and turns into Shadow Hachi. He temporarily becomes the head of the Church of Scientology after Tom Cruise locks himself in this character's closet, and earlier joined the cult of David Blaine with his three friends. His grandfather always calls him "Billy", and his father Randy is a geologist. His breakup with Wendy Testaburger drove him to join the Goth kids in the in the episode "Raisins", but he is probably most famous for his expression of surprise after his parka-wearing best friend dies in almost every episode. FTP, the immortal line "Oh my god! They killed Kenny!" is spoken by what poofball cap-wearing friend of Cartman and Kyle, a character on South Park?

Answer: Stan Marsh [accept Stan Marsh, prompt on partial]

<TQ=99>(07EFT)2. Winner of the first three Three Point Contests, this man would average a triple double in an NBA final series against the Houston Rockets, winning the NBA Finals MVP as well as the last of his three regular season MVP awards.

The clutch performances of this athlete include stealing Isiah Thomas's inbound pass and passing to Dennis Johnson, whose basket would give his team a 3-2 lead over Detroit in the Eastern Conference finals. He may be best remembered for his rivalry with a player whose team defeated his Indiana State team in the 1979 NCAA Championship, and that player, Magic Johnson, would lead the Lakers past his teams for the 1985 and 1987 NBA Championships. FTP, name this Hall of Fame forward who won three NBA titles with the Boston Celtics.

Answer: Larry Bird

<TQ=99>(07EFT)8. The British CD single release of this song also featured the band's "Spitting Out the Demons". The video for this work features a gigantic tower on a floating island from which 2D fails to escape, and the band's "Reject False Icons" campaign is exemplified by the line "Your sound will kill the Inc". The singer laments that he lives in "a melancholy town" where they "never smile", and states that his "dreams, they've got to kiss", because he doesn't get any sleep. The chorus begins "Windmill, windmill for the land/Turn forever hand in hand", and the song both begins and ends with mocking laughter. Featuring De La Soul, FTP, name this 2005 hit from the album "Demon Days" by the Gorillaz.

Answer: Feel Good, Inc

[10] Created by noted Canadian John Kricfalusi, this disgusting little cartoon about a chihuahua and a cat also featured such side characters as Wilbur Cobb and the Powdered Toast Man.

ANSWER: Ren and Stimpy

[10] This awesome cartoon, remade recently into a movie starring Charlize Theron, featured the titular Monican rebel who had a love-hate relationship with Chairman Trevor Goodchild.

ANSWER: Aeon Flux

[10] Story lines in this series, which ran for five seasons in the 90s, include alternate futures involving Cable and Bishop, as well as the Phoenix and Dark Phoenix scenarios.

ANSWER: X-Men: The Animated Series

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)11. Answer some questions about this year's NBA champions, the Miami Heat, for ten points each.

[10] Miami won its first championship over the Dallas Mavericks in part thanks to the coaching of this man, who has now collected seven championship rings. He took over for Stan Van Gundy and transformed the team in under six months.

ANSWER: Patrick James Riley

[10] While playing for Marquette, this man became only the fourth player in NCAA history to record a triple-double. His heroics in the finals, combined with his excellent diving technique, helped the Heat to the title.

ANSWER: Dwyane Tyrone Wade Jr.

[10] This 6-foot, 10-inch center made 5 blocks in Game 6 of the finals. A kidney disease caused him to temporarily retire, and he spent an ineffective year with the Nets before moving to the Raptors and then to Heat.

ANSWER: Alonzo Harding Mourning Jr.

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)11. Originally backed up by Silver Spur, her most significant recent album is American Girl. FTPE.

[10] Name this singer whose hits include the 1985 country ballad "Old Flame" and the more catchy "Love's Been a Little Bit Hard on Me" off of the Quiet Lies album.

ANSWER: Juice Newton

[10] Juice Newton is better known for this even more catchy song, in which she waxes "the joker ain't the only fool who'll do anything for you."

ANSWER: "Queen of Hearts"

[10] Though it's recently been covered by Trick Pony, Juice's single "It's a Heartache" was more famously released by this singer of "Total Eclipse of the Heart."

ANSWER: Bonnie Tyler

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)11. Your team may be losing this game, but at least it's not the Super Bowl. Name these players on the Buffalo Bills in the early 90s, FTPE.

[10] After playing in the USFL for a while, the Hall of Fame quarterback joined the Bills and led them for their entire 90s glory run.

ANSWER: Jim Kelly

[10] This wide receiver fourth all-time in total career receptions was undoubtedly Kelly's favorite target, and Frank Reich's favorite target during his crazy comeback.

ANSWER: Andre Reed

[10] This three-time Pro Bowler played center on that Bills team from 1986-1996. What else do you want me to say about him, he's a center.

ANSWER: Kent Hull

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)11. "An entire generation of Cinderellas, and there's no slipper coming." FTPE.

[10] Name this acclaimed 2000 Cameron Crowe movie, about a kid who follows the band Stillwater.

ANSWER: Almost Famous

[10] In addition to being in a cheesy cabaret band called If All the Stars Were Pretty Babies, this actress played William's rebellious older sister Anita in Almost Famous. Her big sister Emily is the titular character on the FOX show "Bones."

ANSWER: Zooey Deschanel

[10] Maybe the greatest character name in any movie, this is Anna Paquin's groupie character, who we're told has been traded to Deep Purple at the end.

ANSWER: Poxia Aphrodesia (either name)

[10] Carson Kressley, Kyan Douglas, Thom Filicia, Ted Allen, and Jai Rodriguez are the quintet who help the oblivious become hip on this Bravo show.

ANSWER: Queer Eye (for the Straight Guy)

[10] "Grooming guru" Kyan Douglas was recently hired as this company's spokesman. This company's slogan is "because you're worth it," and it provides the makeup for another Bravo show, Project Runway.

ANSWER: L'Oreal Paris

[10] Meanwhile, "fashion savant" Carson Kressley has gotten involved in beauty pageants, serving as a judge for the 2005 incarnation of this beauty pageant owned by Donald Trump.

ANSWER: Miss Universe

[10] This younger brother of Shirley MaLaine played a depressed senator who hires a hit man to kill him in Bulworth. He also played Clyde Barrow in Bonnie and Clyde.

ANSWER: Henry Warren Beatty

[10] In this film, Orson Welles' character Michael O'Hara is hired by Grisby to fake Grisby's murder. In the end, the characters played by Everett Sloane and Rita Hayworth shoot each other in a hall of mirrors.

ANSWER: The Lady from Shanghai

[10] This actor portrayed Augy Holliday, a wimp who hires Automatic Joe to kill him, in 1916's Flirting with Fate. He also played the title roles in 1922's Robin Hood and 1924's The Thief of Baghdad.

ANSWER: Douglas Fairbanks, Sr. or Julius Ullman

[10] Alumni of this North Carolina school include former Chicago Bulls players Darius Songaila and Rusty LaRue, and broadcaster Billy Packer, who played on their 1962 Final Four team. The team is currently coached by Skip Prosser.

ANSWER: Wake Forest University

[10] One of Wake Forest's most famous alumni is this San Antonio Spur power forward who played as one of the Spurs' "Two Towers" alongside David Robinson.

ANSWER: Timothy Theodore Duncan

ANSWER: Tyrone Curtis "Muggsy" Bogues

[10] She plays Cleo, a girl obsessed with Conan O'Brien, in this delightful 2001 movie about cheerleaders who rob a bank to help out their pregnant friend played by Mena Suvari.

ANSWER: Sugar & Spice

[10] Melissa teamed up with John Stamos for this quickly-cancelled ABC show about two criminals Rita and Johnny who make a deal with the FBI. It was definitely no She Spies.

ANSWER: "Thieves"

[10] ABC felt bad enough about the suckitude of "Thieves" that they gave Stamos the show "Jake in Progress" and gave Melissa a role as Lauren Reed, Vaughn's nefarious wife on this ABC drama that made a star out of Jennifer Garner.

ANSWER: "Alias"

[10] This man, who later produced Show Boat, created a sort of forerunner to modern burlesque with he introduced his namesake Follies in New York in 1907.

[10] This supposed author of The G-String Murders was less than thrilled when H.L. Mencken coined the word ecdysiast to describe her stripping. Of course, her stage name Gypsy inspired a famous musical.

ANSWER: Gypsy Rose Lee (Rose Louise Hovick)

[10] Speaking of g-strings, this equally famous American stripper was known for having hers torn off by a fishing rod in her "Flying G" dance and taking a bubble bath onstage while performing at El Rancho Vegas in the 40s and 50s.

ANSWER: Lili St. Cyr (Willis Marie van Schaack)

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)5. Answer the following about students of noted tennis coach Nick Bollettieri FTPE.

[10] At the age of 14, this formerly long-haired tennis player attended Nick Bollettieri's academy in Florida. He is one of five players to win all four Grand Slam singles titles, and is married to Steffi Graf.

ANSWER: Andre Agassi

[10] This tall Frenchwoman was coached by Nick Bollettieri after firing her father, who occasionally screamed abuse at her opponents. She defeated Arantxa Sanchez-Vicario to win the 1995 Australian Open and won the 2000 French Open.

ANSWER: Mary Pierce

[10] This college basketball color commentator for ESPN relocated his family to Florida so his daughters could attend Nick Bollettieri's academy. He is known for catchphrases such as "diaper dandy" and "Maalox time."

ANSWER: Dick Vitale

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)6. Answer the following on songs inspired by fruit, FTPE.

[10] The Queen Latifah song of this name opens with the line, "Who you gonna call when it's time to brawl." In another song, the Hoosier Hot Shots expressed their liking for this fruit "because they have no bones."

ANSWER: bananas

[10] In this song by the Presidents of the USA, the singer states that he is "movin' to the country" and that he's "gonna eat a lot" of the titular fruit

ANSWER: "Peaches"

[10] This band's citrus-inspired songs include "Tangerine" and "The Lemon Song," from their self-titled 3rd and 2nd albums, respectively.

ANSWER: Led Zeppelin

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)6. Identify the Pink Floyd albums from clues, for ten points each.

[10] Probably Pink Floyd's most famous album, it holds the record for the most weeks on the Billboard 200 and includes such songs as "Time," "Money," and "Us and Them."

ANSWER: (The) Dark Side of the Moon

[10] Including the tracks "Mother" and "Comfortably Numb," this album is best remembered among non-fans for the song whose lyrics state "we don't need no education, we don't need no thought control."

ANSWER: The Wall

[10] Released with the 20-minute "Echoes" on the B side, this album also includes the song "Seamus," which was played in the beginning of the film version of Rosencranz and Guildenstern are Dead, as well as "One of These Days."

ANSWER: Meddle

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)8. He is the subject of a forthcoming game subtitled Hyborian Adventures, although he first appeared in a series published in the magazine Weird Tales. For ten points each:

[10] Identify this fictional character created by Robert Howard, famously played by the Governorator in a 1982 movie.

ANSWER: Conan the Barbarian (or Cimmerian)

[10] Although the phrase comes from Harold Lamb's fictionalization of Genghis Khan's life, this, according to Conan, is what is best in life.

ANSWER: to crush your enemies, see them driven before you, and hear the lamentations of their women (accept variants that mention all three activities)

[10] In the 1982 film, Conan was opposed by this character, played by James Earl Jones, a shape-shifting priest of a snake cult who kills Conan's parents.

ANSWER: Thulsa Doom

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)9. Among the plausible claims made by this group of thinkers is that "sheep go to heaven, goats go to hell," and that "if you want to have cities, you've got to build roads," in the song "Comanche." For ten points each:

[10] Identify this band from Sacramento, California, that is fronted by John McCrea.

ANSWER: Cake

[10] Cake made it big with this single from their album Fashion Nugget, in which racecar drivers "churn and yearn and burn for the cup" while a woman is "all alone in her time of need."

ANSWER: The Distance

[10] Fashion Nugget also contains a song in which the singer claims "I won't be soothed," and which shares its name with an animated MTV series about a high school student with the last name Morgendorffer.

ANSWER: Daria

<BQ=>(06EFT\_BO)9. He played Andy Kaufman's sidekick Bob Zmuda in Man on the Moon. FTPE.

[10] Name this actor who has appeared more recently as Inspector Uhl in The Illusionist and as Cleveland Heep in Lady in the Water.

ANSWER: Paul Giamatti

[10] Paul Giamatti starred opposite Thomas Haden Church in this Alexander Payne film set mostly in the Santa Ynez Valley wine country.

ANSWER: Sideways

[10] Paul Giamatti had a small part in this film as a scam artist taken hostage by Danny Roman, played by Samuel L. Jackson. Kevin Spacey co-stars as Chris Sabian.

ANSWER: The Negotiator

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)1. Answer some questions about a rockin' dude, for ten points each.

[10] Although reputedly so tone-deaf that Richard Wright had to tune the band's guitars in David Gilmour's absence, this man nevertheless pumped out some awesome bass lines with Pink Floyd on tracks like "One of These Days." Oh yeah, he also pretty much wrote The Wall.

ANSWER: Roger Waters

[10] Waters' best known solo work is probably this 1987 concept album which follows the exploits of a hyperintelligent disabled man named Billy.

ANSWER: Radio K.A.O.S.

[10] Waters' 1992 solo album Amused to Death was inspired by Amusing Ourselves to Death, a critique of modern communication by this late media studies professor at NYU.

ANSWER: Neil Postman

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)13. Identify some shows on the Cartoon Network, FTPE:

[10] The title group consists of Master Shake, Frylock and Meatwad; they oppose Dr. Weird and Steve. According to the theme song, they're "number 1 in the hood, g".

ANSWER: Aqua Teen Hunger Force

[10] This work of claymation is a parody of "Davey and Goliath". Characters include Revered Putty, Principal Fakey, and the title character's family, the Puppingtons.

ANSWER: Moral Orel

[10] Also on the Adult Swim block is this show that uses action figures and puppets in short comedic sketches. They recently aired a Star Wars special.

ANSWER: Robot Chicken

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)13. In one appearance of a character played by this actor, that character is associated with the Gypsy Kings' version of "Hotel California." For ten points each:

[10] Identify this man who played Herb Stempel in Quiz Show, but is surely better remembered for briefly playing The Jesus in The Big Lebowski.

ANSWER: John Turturro

[10] Turturro's work with the Coen brothers goes back all the way to Miller's Crossing, and he also played the titular role in this 1991 Coen's movie about a Jewish playwright from New York who goes to Hollywood.

ANSWER: Barton Fink

[10] Turturro also played the titular role in this 2001 film about a chessmaster based on a similarly titled novel by Vladimir Nabokov.

ANSWER: The Luzhin Defense (do not accept "The Defense," since that's not the movie title)

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)13. X-men storylines often borrow their titles from what could be called "real" literature. Name some examples, FTPE:

[10] In this saga, a clone of Cable named Stryfe wreaks havoc on the X-men, and this storyline ends with the release of the Legacy Virus. It takes its name from a Norman Mailer work.

ANSWER: X-Cutioner's Song (The work is The Executioner's Song)

[10] The Ultimate version of Longshot is introduced in this arc; he is trapped on an island as part of a reality show where mutants are killed by big-game hunters, much like a namesake story by Richard Connell.

ANSWER: The Most Dangerous Game

[10] Illyana Rasputina is tricked into opening a gateway to hell by N'Astirh, and Madelyne Pryor is corrupted into becoming the Goblin Queen. It takes its name from a Dante work.

ANSWER: Inferno

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)14. Identify the following dishes which involve our favorite kind of poultry--duck, of course, FTPE:

[10] In August 2006, Chicago banned this French delicacy, which is the liver of a duck or goose.

ANSWER: foie gras

[10] Another French dish involves preserving a duck by salting it with spices such as garlic, then cooking it in a broth and letting it bake. It can usually be kept for at least another month if refrigerated.

ANSWER: duck confit or confit de canard

[10] This Cajun dish is believed to have been invented by either "Herbert's Specialty Meats" or Paul Prudhomme. As its name indicates, it involves stuffing three deboned types of poultry inside each other, one of which is a duck.

ANSWER: turducken [accept chuckey]

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)16. He won Best Actor Academy Award nominations for his role in Berkeley Square and his portrayal of Professor Henry Higgins in the 1938 film adaptation of Pygmalion. FTPE:

[10] Identify this actor who played Holger Brandt in Intermezzo, dying in 1943 after his aircraft was shot down by a German Junker over the Bay of Biscay. He apparently was not mistaken for Winston Churchill.

ANSWER: Leslie Howard

[10] Leslie Howard played this famous fictional character. That character loves his cousin Melanie, but he is obsessed over by Scarlett O'Hara.

ANSWER: Ashley Wilkes [prompt on "Wilkes"]

[10] Howard also appeared in The Petrified Forest, in which he allegedly insisted that this actor appear as Duke Mantee. This appearance by that actor preceded more notable roles, such as those in The African Queen, The Maltese Falcon, and Casablanca.

ANSWER: Humphrey Bogart

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)16. Identify the following moves you may see in a chess game, FTPE:

[10] This move allows a player to move an untouched, unchecked king two squares towards an untouched rook and move the rook to the square the king crossed over.

ANSWER: castling [accept long/short castling or Rochieren, Rochada, Roque]

[10] This chess maneuver allows a pawn to take an opposing pawn which has moved two squares on its first step if the opposing pawn could have been captured had it moved one square.

ANSWER: en passant

[10] This two-move opening involves White moving the king's pawn to e4, to which Black responds by moving the queen-side bishop's pawn to c5, giving Black control over the d5 square. It has been used in 17% of matches between grandmasters.

ANSWER: Sicilian Defense [prompt on partial answer]

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)19. Everyone knows Clay Buchholz threw a no-hitter against the Orioles this year, but answer the following about failed no-hit bids this season, FTPE:

[10] This Boston Red Sox pitcher and former World Series co-MVP with Randy Johnson had a no-hitter with two outs in the ninth inning before Shannon Stewart slapped a base hit to right field.

ANSWER: Curt Schilling

[10] This Taiwanese-born Yankee pitcher, renowned for his "bowling ball-like" sinker, had his perfect game bid broken with one out in the eighth inning with a solo shot by Ben Broussard.

ANSWER: Chien-Ming Wang

[10] Jeff Baker led off the top of the ninth to break up the no-hit bid by this Toronto pitcher, who would finish the game with seven strikeouts.

ANSWER: Dustin McGowan

[10] This Swede won eleven total titles, including both Wimbledon and the French Open for three consecutive years. Roger Federer recently tied his record by winning Wimbledon for the fifth straight year.

[10] The second winningest American male tennis player in terms of Grand Slam singles titles, this player won 8 of them, including the Australian Open 4 times. His last attempt to take that title came in 2007, where he lost to Benjamin Becker, after which he retired.

ANSWER: Andre Agassi

[10] This Australian lefty with 11 Grand Slam singles titles completed the Grand Slam in the same year as both an amateur, in 1962, and a pro, in 1969. The center court at Melbourne Park bears his name.

ANSWER: Rod Laver

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)4. If you listened closely enough on the day of its announcement, you could probably hear the entire nation of South Korea celebrating. FTPE:

[10] Name this upcoming sequel to a popular Blizzard game that, according to the character Artanis, is "not Warcraft in space".

ANSWER: Starcraft 2

[10] This Terran and leader of his namesake "Raiders" is set to make a return in Starcraft 2. During the events of the first game, he initially served under Arcturus Mengsk and later allied with Tassadar.

ANSWER: Jim Raynor

[10] This ancient race is set to play a large role in Starcraft 2, but not as playable characters. They created the Protoss and the Zerg thousands of years ago.

ANSWER: Xel'Naga

<BQ=>(07EFT\_BO)4. The first round of the 2007 NFL Draft was the longest in its history. Answer the following questions concerning it, FTPE:

[10] It was no surprise that JaMarcus Russell was selected first overall by the Raiders, but the big news on draft day was the slide of this Notre Dame quarterback, who was eventually selected by the Cleveland Browns with the 22nd pick.

ANSWER: Brady Quinn

[10] The Miami Dolphins, expected by many to take Brady Quinn, instead went with this Ohio State wideout, drawing many jeers from the crowd.

ANSWER: Ted Ginn, Jr.

[10] After playing three years at the University of California, this running back was selected by the 12th overall by the Buffalo Bills.

ANSWER: Marshawn Lynch
